

## Responsible Minerals Sourcing Policy

Malaysia Smelting Corporation Berhad (MSC) is committed to sourcing feed materials responsibly through a combination of efforts, and in close cooperation with Governments, industries and associations. As a leading player in the tin industry, MSC has set out the following goals:

While sourcing from or operating in conflict-affected and high-risk areas, MSC will neither tolerate nor by any means profit from, contribute to assist with or facilitate the commission by any party of the following risks:

- I. any forms of torture, cruelty, inhuman and degrading treatment
- II. any forms of forced or compulsory labour, which means work or service which is extracted from any person under the menace of penalty and for which said person has not offered himself voluntary
- III. the worst forms of child labour
- IV. other gross human rights violations and abuses such as widespread sexual violence
- V. war crimes, or other serious violations of international humanitarian law, crimes against humanity or genocide,
- VI. Direct or indirect support to non-state armed groups,
- VII. Direct or indirect support to public or private security forces,
- VIII. Bribery and fraudulent misrepresentation of the origin of minerals
  - IX. Money laundering
  - X. Non-payment of taxes, fees and royalties to governments

## Risk Management

Will not tolerate any activity that directly or indirectly finances or benefits armed groups or contribute to conflict or human rights abuses in Conflict Affected and High Risk (CAHRA) countries and non-CAHRA countries.

Agree to eliminate, direct and indirect support to public or private security forces who illegally control mine sites, transportation routes and upstream actors in the supply chain.

Will not offer, promise, give or demand any bribes and will resist the solicitation of bribes to conceal or disguise the origin of minerals, to misrepresent taxes, fees and royalties paid to governments for the purpose of mineral extraction, trade, handling, transport and export.

Promote and support processes and schemes that legitimize minerals from the region to enter the global supply chain, thereby supporting the economy of the region and the local communities that depend on this trade for their livelihood.

Promote sustainable development of tin industries in the region through engagement in industrial scale exploration, mining, mineral processing and smelting of tin and associated minerals.

We will immediately suspend or discontinue engagement with upstream suppliers where we identify a reasonable risk that they are sourcing from, or linked to, any party committing serious abuses as defined in paragraph 2.
